Cable Street - School Play







Rehearsals for this year's play are in full swing. Once again, we are participating in The National Theatre Connections scheme. The National theatre commissions 10 new plays for young performers which are challenging and exciting. Our chosen play is *Cable Street*.

It is about two girls growing up in London's Jewish east end in the 1930s. Leah and Kitty are blood sisters, best friends and more... but they get caught up in the political turmoil caused by Oswald Mosley's fascist Blackshirts. At the iconic Battle of Cable Street in 1936, hundreds of thousands of working class people come together to fight the police to defend the Jewish East End from fascism. Kitty and Leah are torn apart politically, their love for each other ensnared, like a rabbit in a trap. As their passion and the political tensions grow stronger and stronger, pulling each of them every which way, the snare can only get tighter and tighter until something snaps. The play will be performed in March.



New Schedule for LFD Testing


Please note that for those of you who have given permission for your children to receive and use Lateral Flow Device Tests, Welsh Government have changed their guidance regarding the frequency of testing. The expectation is that all staff and students of secondary age and above should test three times a week using LFDs (on Sunday night/Monday morning, Tuesday night/Wednesday morning and Thursday night/Friday morning) in the week before returning to school and to then continue testing regularly three times a week after the start of term in January.

If your child (years 7 to 11) is not currently participating in the testing programme and you would like them to, then please email info@aberconwy.conwy.sch.uk to request an electronic consent form so that your child can be given the LFD test equipment. Please note this form must be completed by a parent.

Students in years 12 and 13 must complete their own electronic consent form which will be made available to them on their Year Group Team. They do not need to have parental consent.

Jacob competed in the Welsh National Athletic Championships, held in Newport in August and came first, winning gold with a jump of 6.31m! Jacob regularly travels to Wrexham for specialist training and is now ranked number one in Wales for the under 17s by the official power of ten, where all UK athletes are officially ranked.

On The Road to Cleaner Air & Wind Turbines Workshop

Year 7, 8 and 9 Eco Council members recently took part in a workshop where they explored different ways to tackle air pollution and looked at ways emissions might be reduced across Wales. They also learnt how a wind turbine works, and how they are engineered and constructed. Working in small teams, the students were then asked to design and create the most efficient wind turbine.

The students set to work, using redesigned wind turbine model kits to build their own turbines and then recorded how much energy they generated, adjusting their designs to maximise efficiency throughout the experiment until each team had a design they were happy with. Art at the Royal Cambrian Academy Gallery



Art students from Years 9, 10, 12 and 13 have visited the Royal Cambrian Academy Gallery in Conwy where they have gained some inspiration from the recent exhibition called 'Art of Perseverance'. This exhibition showcased the ways in which six artists have used art to cope.

Students were able to see inspirational artworks from talented artists Jan Gardner, Iwan Gwyn Parry,
Peter Holloway, Mary Lloyd Jones, Tim Pugh and Gilly Thomas.
Though each of these artists have faced different challenges,

they are united in their use of art to continue through difficult times. Art, for them, is perseverance.

The last year has been particularly challenging for the arts and creative industries, despite this one of our students has been given the fantastic opportunity to exhibit her artwork at the gallery. Eco Council Students Achieve Awards







Members from the school Eco Council, made up of representatives from all year groups, enjoyed their first group stay at Bod Silyn cottage where they worked together to achieve the John Muir Awards and the Junior Forester's Awards.

Carrying full rucksacks, they forged new friendships as they explored the fringes of Snowdonia National Park before establishing a camp and cooking food over a campfire. They spent the evening star gazing and identifying some of the constellations that they would be sleeping under and learning about the history of Bod Silyn. Sam, a year 12 student really enjoyed his time at Bod Silyn, he said, "The cottage is cool and I loved cooking over the fire."

The following day they learnt how to use a bow saw and a pruning saw safely as they helped to clear some rhododendron and other invasive species. They also built a sawhorse and learnt how to tie knots and make lashings in the process. Year 9 student, Nell, found the practical elements fun, she said "I liked clearing the bushes and using the saws."

During the two days, students worked hard to increase their knowledge and understanding of the natural environment which resulted in them achieving the John Muir Award, which encourages people to connect with, enjoy and care for wild places by completing four Challenges that lie at the heart of the award: Discover, Explore, Conserve, Share.

Due to their practical pruning and conservation efforts, they also completed their Junior Forester Award, which gives children and young people an insight into a career in Forestry, as well as the practical ability to assist in woodland management in their schools and local communities. These new-found skills will help the Eco Council members with their aim to improve the school environment and establish Ysgol Aberconwy as an Eco School.

Mr Colin O'Rouke, Director of Learning – Outdoor Learning said, "The pupils enjoyed exploring the school's land and cottage and had a great time. They will take home some great memories and a few blisters! I look forward to taking the lower school Eco Council to Bod Silyn, with a few of the older pupils as helpers."

It seems that the students are equally keen to return, with year 11 student, Kieran saying that he wanted to go back and help out with the lower school Eco Council visit too.



Shana Takes the Wicket
